The Department is currently running two regular academic programs - undergraduate program and graduate program.

Graduate

Currently, the department offers an M. Sc degree in Computer Science which is provided with three options:

Plan A, with thesis
Plan B, with project, and
Plan C, course-work only

Under **Plan A**, the candidate is required to complete a minimum of 25 credit hours of course work and a preparation of an acceptable thesis (worth 6 credits) under the supervision of a faculty member and an oral defense of the thesis before an examining committee.

Under **Plan B**, the candidate is required to complete a minimum of 31 credit hours of course work including a compulsory project course.

Under **Plan C**, the candidate is required to complete a minimum of 31 credit hours of course work.

Students can also enroll on a part-time basis if they fulfil the specified requirments.
